It gives L.P.S immense pleasure in welcoming your child's first steps into the school. The school, with its origins in 2001 as a primary school, has today emerged as the first choice for many parents.

We are proud of the school's standing in the community and its reputation as a centre of excellence in many aspects of education.

We are a happy school with a staff dedicated to bringing out the best in every individual and instilling in each pupil a real sense of belonging. We do that by providing high standards of teaching and first-class facilities. We are also an open school, ensuring that parents have quick and easy access to us at all times.

This Prospectus underlines our philosophy and gives you an insight into how we operate and is designed to encourage you and your child to become a part of the Longview Public School, Nainital.

Equipped for Learning:

LPS is a thriving, complete school with a tradition of excellence in the community. The institution is located on Longview, a pristine property below Rajbhawan, a stone's throw away from the city centre, with the buildings being a blend of old and new architecture and providing comfortable accommodation for over 600 students.

In the past few years LPS students have been high achievers in board exams. This is due to a highly motivated, able workforce which takes pride in the achievements of the school.

Though still young, LPS has the distinction of becoming the first 100% digital school of Nainital.

LPS, in a short span of 18 years, has been rated as the Top CBSE School of Nainital twice, in 2016 & 2018, the Top Day-cum-Boarding School for Holistic Development in Uttarakhand in 2018 and also the Most Innovative School in Uttarakhand in 2019.



INTRODUCTION:

LONGVIEW PUBLIC SCHOOL was started as a primary school in the year 2001 with the mission **“EDUCATION FOR ALL”**.

The management of LONGVIEW PUBLIC SCHOOL is in the hands of leading educationists. LPS is an English medium residential-cum-day school for boys from classes I to X. The school has been granted affiliation by CBSE Delhi and strictly follows the curriculum prescribed by CBSE.

To our way of thinking education means natural growth and unfolding of all the faculties. With this in mind, the school seeks to provide a situation and environment that engenders activities of different kinds. We make a special effort to cultivate the hands as well as the head, encouraging creative expression, however crude the form it may at first assume. We want each child to learn the secrets of his own personality and to acquire satisfactory outlets for his physical and emotional life.

One often hears several clichés when it comes to defining the ideal school environment and culture. There are several words that are used: joyful, child centered, interactive, one that allows the child to construct knowledge etc., but in LPS **“All we do is to create a warm and welcoming environment for the children in our school — learning takes place automatically as children love to come to the school every day”**.

Open book symbolizing the scholar's thirst for knowledge, **the 7 rays of the sun** representing the virtues of strength, unity and non-violence and **the sun** amidst the logo stands proud as a symbol of knowledge and brilliance, denoting the physical, mental and spiritual unfoldment of the scholar.

The very name of the school '**LONGVIEW**' implies adoption of a broad vision - which makes one rise above the mere normal in life. Thus is our dream to see all the scholars rising above the average individual and picking up the virtues that they have imbibed from their school and spreading them all over the world.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES:

- LONGVIEW PUBLIC School aims to be an outstanding school where young minds enjoy learning, achieve highly and move on with confidence.
- LPS aims to provide an environment that encourages each individual to develop qualities of self-discipline, motivation, makes them confident and competent members of the society.
- LPS will build a strong and effective partnership with parents and the local community.
- LPS will continue to develop the literary, creativity and communicative skills necessary for students to take part in the progress of the society.
- LPS will develop the positive ethos and learning culture in students for incessant improvement to meet highest expectations.
- LPS will develop positive qualities in students in all areas of life and character.

- LPS will recognize, promote and boost the feeling of self-worth in each and every student.
- LPS will develop socially acceptable behavior and attitude in students.
- LPS will develop a broad and balanced curriculum to meet the demands of modern society.
- LPS will develop in students care and respect for people and the environment.

PERSONAL GUIDANCE AND INSTRUCTIONS

By the following initiatives the institution ensures individual attention coupled with positive social interaction:

- Limiting the number of students in a class so that the teacher has adequate time for each child.
- Students and teaching staff have lunch together, ensuring students learn table manners in a short time and the quality of food is maintained. This leads to healthy interaction between teachers and students (Boarders as well as Day Scholars).
- By making games, sports and other extra-curricular activities mandatory for all students. There are designated days for each class spread over the week when the students (Boarders and Day Scholars) shall participate in these activities.
- Every child is a member of one of the four Houses and Clubs. A student can approach the Master/ Mistress of his respective house or Club in-charge in case of any issue related to participation or any other issue.

CURRICULAM / LEARNING SCHEME :

- English is the medium of instruction and examination.
- Classrooms are equipped with digital technology to ensure learning becomes joyful and interactive.
- The academic year extends from March to December and is divided into two terms, ending June / July and November / December. The school has a short summer break for 10 days and a long winter break of approximately 2 to 2½ months at the end of the academic year.
- In addition to regular subjects like English, Hindi, Maths, Social Studies, Science and Environmental Education, the school also teaches music, art, craft and physical education. Computer education starts right from Class I. The students are also encouraged to take an active interest in their environment through Nature study. Regular sports and games are compulsory for all the students.
- Learning also takes place through recreational facilities like TV, films, town turns and nature walks on a regular basis. Moral education forms an integral part of the curriculum.
- Social work projects are compulsory for the pupils. This is to teach them the dignity of labour and also to understand the functioning of the society.

LEARNING SCHEMES :

The management and teachers of LPS Nainital have transformed their vision of LPS culture into reality.

CLASSES I & II: The school's focus at this level is to make the transition between the secure home environment and formal schooling an interesting experience for the child. The child is encouraged to imagine, show creativity and provided with ample opportunity to express himself freely. LPS ensures developing basic language skills and conversational ability. The curriculum is child-centric and all the activities are planned according to the needs and ability of the child. Various celebrations and round-the-year class activities allow for self expression and confidence building.

CLASSES III TO V: The child, already familiar with basic skills in English language, is now initiated into more formal instruction through interactive techniques and application. In science, the focus is on developing scientific skills and aptitude and in making the child aware of his surroundings. In mathematics, the problem-solving techniques are taught using different methods viz: models & concepts. Music is an integral part of curriculum.

Round-the-year extracurricular activities such as inter house activities and class activities allow children not only to gain confidence but also helps them to realize their potential in different fields. The main aim at this level is to lay solid foundations and prepare children to understand more complex information at higher levels.

CLASSES VI TO X: The course curriculum is based on CBSE guidelines, offering formal education in subjects like English, Hindi, Maths, Science, Social Studies, Computer and Environmental Education.

Music, Sports, class activities and inter house activities form an integral part of education. Students are also exposed to inter school competitions and tournaments in the school or outside the school.

PROGRESS AND PROMOTION CRITERIA

1. The progress of the child is assessed throughout the academic year by the teachers. Daily assessment of the child is done based on class work, home work and series of tests conducted at regular intervals. The school follows continuous and comprehensive assessment and ensures that children do their work on regular basis.
2. The promotion of a student does not depend upon a single annual examination. For a student to be promoted to the next class, he is expected to pass in all the major subjects and also show progress during the year in all other subjects. The decision to promote a student lies with the Principal and is final and binding on the parents.
3. Up till class VIII the child will be made to repeat the class only if the child absents himself from the school due to medical or other reasons, or the School/Principal, in due consultation with the parents, are of the opinion that it's for the explicit benefit of the child. However, in class IX and X, promotion is strictly based on CBSE norms applicable from time to time.
4. Students who fail to secure minimum passing grades and demonstrate poor scholastic and co-scholastic performance as determined by the School/Principal, and the school is of the opinion that repeating the class is of little or no benefit to them, shall have to be withdrawn from the school.
5. The academic performance and behaviour of students will be under constant scrutiny.
6. The record of students' academic attainment will be sent to the parents / guardians at the end of each period of assessment.
7. Students who make little progress, owing to habitual absenteeism, idleness or proven incapability, may be asked to leave at the end of the academic year.
8. In case a student absents himself from a test/exam for no valid reason, no retest will be conducted. A retest may be conducted for exceptional cases at the sole discretion of the Principal, who will be the final authority in such matters.
9. Should a child fail to qualify for promotion for two consecutive years, he will have to be withdrawn from the school.
10. A student using unfair means in exams or carrying unlawful material shall be severely punished, even to the extent of expulsion from the school, or de-badged if he holds any position, or barred from various memberships of clubs etc.
11. 'Promotion Granted' request to be recorded on a students' T.C. will not be entertained in case parents wish to withdraw the student before completion of the academic year, or who fails to secure promotion.

EDUCATIONAL TOURS / TRIPS / SWIMMING WORKSHOP :

The school organizes a wide range of educational tours that form an integral part of day-to-day learning. These trips are beneficial for all classes and age groups. Students are exposed to practical learning by visits to Zoo, Forests, Nature Walks, Museums, Hospitals, Post Office, Picnic Spots, Gardens and Observatory etc. For higher classes, tours may also include visits to factories, Civil Court, High Court, Industrial Units, out station trips etc.

Students may also be taken for short trips to neighbouring cities and states. Nominal charges will have to be borne by the students to meet and cover the expenses of such educational trips.

Learning through trips, trekking, camping, workshops, games are made available to students. The school has associated with some organizations that help plan these activities.

A compulsory swimming workshop for boarders [optional for day scholars] is organized at our offsite swimming venue.

RULES FOR ADMISSION :

1. The school accepts children from the age of 5 years and above.
2. The following documents are to be furnished by the parents / guardians at the time of enrolment.
 - i) Certificate of birth of the child.
 - ii) The last progress report of the child.
 - iii) Aadhar Cards of the Child, Mother and Father
3. Admission will be granted at the sole discretion of the Principal.
4. The School reserves the right of refusing admission / readmission without assigning any reason for doing so.
5. The School does not entirely go by the progress reports or certificates from previous school. In order to assess a child's suitability for the class applied, the school makes its own assessment. The progress report is however required for scrutiny.
6. All newly registered students will be assessed for suitability for the class applied for. If on the basis of the assessment the child is not found fit for the class applied, the parents may be advised to admit the child in the suitable class.
7. The prospectus and registration fee is non-refundable and non-adjustable. The payment of the registration fee does not guarantee admission into the school. The admission will depend upon the vacancy in the class applied for, after the successful completion of the admission process and personal interaction with the student and parents.
8. Should a child be found fit for the class in which admission is desired, a provisional offer of admission will be made which must be accepted in writing within 7 days of the offer being made. The acceptance of the offer must be accompanied with the 1st installment of the school fee (refer to the fee details) through Bank Draft in favour of Longview Public School, Nainital payable at Nainital or in cash to be deposited at Nainital Bank, Tallital branch, Nainital.

The admission will be confirmed only after the receipt of the above payment and the transfer certificate [TC] from the School last attended.

Parents who fail to submit the TC will have to forfeit the admission fee.

For class I, the submission of TC is not mandatory. However copy of the Birth certificate issued by competent authority and original for verification is must.

9. The student's name, Date of Birth, Mother and Father's name as recorded in the TC or Birth Certificate or notified at the time of admission with proof, will be considered and will not be changed subsequently by the school authorities.
10. The admission of a child will mean a complete acceptance by parents / guardians of all the school rules as in force and amended from time to time.
11. Should the newly admitted student, either day scholar or boarder, fail to join the school within 3 days of the official date of opening without written acceptance from the Principal, his name will be struck off from the school register and no claim for refund of fee will be entertained.
12. Seeking admission through unfair means or trying to influence the decision of the Management / Principal of the school through other sources will weaken a candidate's prospects of admission.
13. It is mandatory for all the existing students to fill the admission form for the next higher class after promotion within 7 days of declaration of result, failing which their admission in the school will stand cancelled. In case such students wish to continue their education in the school, they will be treated as fresh cases of admission and they will be given admission provided there are vacancies in the class.

SCHOOL TIMINGS :

1. Classes are held Monday to Friday from 8:50 a.m. to 3.10 p.m.
2. On Saturday the school timing is from 8:50 a.m. to 1 p.m.
3. Parents are requested to strictly adhere to school timings; else the children may remain un-supervised.

LUNCH FACILITY FOR DAY-SCHOLARS :

Day-scholars are given the option to have lunch along with the boarders at a nominal extra cost. This facility is being extended to day-scholars keeping in view the growing dietary needs of the students, local climatic conditions and for better interaction among students. Parents will have to exercise their option at the time of admission. Lunch facility is mandatory for students of classes I, II and III.

GAMES AND CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES :

1. The school has a play ground and an assembly ground. In addition, the school also has a basketball court and facility for indoor games.
2. Class games as well as inter-house matches are organized throughout the year. Every student has ample opportunity to participate and develop sporting skills.
3. On admission each child is allotted to one of the four Houses: TRISHUL (RED), NEELKANTH (BLUE), KAILASH (GREEN) and KUNCHANJUNGA (YELLOW). The school organizes almost all major games of interest for children on competitive basis among the four houses.
4. Various competitive indoor activities, spaced throughout the session are held in the school. Opportunities for participation in such activities as extempore, declamation, debate, dramatics, inter-class verse-speaking and elocution contests, as well as vocal and instrumental music soirees, are provided to all students, both day-scholars and boarders. Participation in these activities enhances their self confidence, intensifies the bond of union between residential and non-residential students and contributes effectively to the formation of the sense of maturity and breadth of vision.

5. All boarders are obliged to participate to the full extent of their ability in the games and other outdoor activities organized by the school as well as in academic, social and cultural life. Exemption from such activities as games, gymnastics and athletics is given, but rarely, and that also on medical grounds under certification from the students' family doctor and that of the Medical Officer of the school. Day-scholars must attend games and other activities outside school hours when required to do so and the school authorities deem participation in such circumstances compulsory.
6. The children are given ample opportunities to participate in Inter-School Competitions organized by L.P.S., other schools, government and social organizations.

STUDENT COUNCIL :

Active participation is the only way students can be made to feel involved in the development of the school — forming a school council is one way to achieve this goal. The school selects a functional and effective student's council in the beginning of the year consisting of a group of students from higher classes who are carefully selected after analysis of their academic records, attitude and aptitude, nominated by teachers followed by personal interview.

A School Head Boy, Games Captain, Cultural Secretary, Day & Boarding Prefects, Club Heads, Members of Editorial Board, Captains and Vice Captains of four Houses are selected.

The student council is expected to exhibit leadership qualities, to set an example of disciplined individuals, respectful towards teachers, fellow students and to follow school rules; co-ordinate and offer help in all school functions; to give meaningful suggestions and feedback to the Principal / school management on various school routines. They are expected to perform all this willingly while maintaining their own academic performance.

SCHOOL LIBRARY :

The School has a well equipped library for primary and senior sections. All classes are provided with at least one library period per week. Students are promoted to develop reading habit by utilizing their free time and use library facility for reference material to be used for preparation of debate, speech, declamation etc.

Students are bound by the following library rules:

1. Students must carry the library card signed by librarian. Books are issued only against the card.
2. Books are issued from class V onwards.
3. Books marked, disfigured or damaged will have to be replaced or paid for by the borrower.
4. Students are allowed to borrow books only on their own card.
5. Students are not allowed to bring their personal books, CD's or any other belongings into the library.
6. Students must help to maintain silence in the library.
7. Students should not move books, magazines, periodicals, newspapers from shelves and help maintain and organize them in open shelves.

INTERNET FACILITY :

Internet facility is a part of the library. The facility is for the use of faculty members for gathering information on various aspects of teaching and education. Facility is also available to senior students, particularly to boarders, in groups on regular basis, under strict supervision for collecting information for projects and keeping in touch with their parents.

CLUBS :

Apart from academics, indoor-outdoor games, inter-school competitions and participation in activities organized by various Government Private organizations and NGOs of the city for schools, we offer our students to be part of one or more clubs run by the school to harness their talents. The following Clubs are operational in the school :

1. **Science Club**
2. **English Club**
3. **Music Club**
4. **Eco Club**

FEE STRUCTURE / RULES :

Details of fee for boarders and day scholars will be given by the Accounts Office on a separate sheet.

Fee Rules :

1. The fee structure given to parents does not include charges for board examination, text books, stationery, extra diet, uniform, shoe repairs, breakage, specially prescribed medicines, tonics and other charges of a similar nature. The actual cost of these, when incurred, will be included in the terminal bill.

All payments for boarders must be made either in cash or by Demand Draft in favour of Longview Public School, Nainital payable at Nainital. Please note that money orders, Cheques and all other forms of payment sent directly to the Principal will be returned to the sender by Registered Mail A.D. at sender's expense.

2. Day-scholars and boarders are required to pay their annual fee either in one installment for the entire year at the time of admission or in three installments, the first payable at the time of the admission, the second by 1st June and the third by 1st October.
3. No student will be allowed to return to the School unless his account for the previous term / year has been settled in full.
4. Should a boarder be withdrawn from the school on any date, up to and including 30th June, three month's notice is required, or in lieu, 3 month's boarding fees, 3 months of tuition fees and other fees shall be charged. On and after 1st July, in the event of withdrawal of a boarder, with or without notice, boarding fees, tuition fees and other fees for the full year will be charged.
5. Should a day-scholar be withdrawn from the School on any date up to and including 30th June, three month's notice is required or, in lieu, 3 months of tuition fees and other fees will be charged. On and after 1st July, in the event of the withdrawal of a day scholar, with or without notice, tuition fees and other fees for the full year will be charged.

6. If a student is to be withdrawn at the end of an academic session, the school should be informed at the time of submitting the form for promotion to higher class for the next academic year, failing which the fee rules given in para 4 & 5 will apply.
7. Private account: Every student must have a private account for ongoing expenses. In case of boarders this money is to cover the individual expenses of the students on such items as pocket money, books & stationery, repair of shoes, postage, cost of board examinations, medicines, laundry, video shows, magazines etc. The private account will not cover the expenses that may be incurred on account of replacement of uniforms / clothing, cost of hospitalization and extra pocket money. No student will be admitted to the School at the opening of the term unless the required amount has been deposited in the private account of the child.

Any sum due on account of any of the above items will be debited, in the first instance from the private account of the student. Credit facility will not be provided to any student should his personal account be in debit.

WITHDRAWAL :

1. Should parents, on their own accord, decide against sending their child to the school, after having confirmed the admission and the 1st installment / admission fee deposited with the school, they will not be entitled to a full refund of fee and rules mentioned in para 4 & 5 of FEE STRUCTURE/RULES will apply.
2. Parents and guardians who persistently disobey the school rules, or who are constantly over-demanding in attitude, will be deemed non-cooperative. In the absence of the possibility of a variable working relationship with them to the advantage of their wards, the Principal has the right to desire the withdrawal of the latter.
3. When the parents of the Day-Scholars or the Boarders are called to the school by the Principal to discuss aspects of their child's academic performance or general behaviour, they must assume that the reasons for such a call are of considerable importance or urgency. Hence, unless their co-operation is immediate and wholehearted, they shall be obliged to withdraw their child from the school.
4. It is demanded of each student that he participates in any or all the extra-curricular activities of the school when called on to do so. Without exemption of the Principal, a student's refusal to comply in this matter will entail his immediate and compulsory withdrawal from the school. The rule applies both to the Day-Scholars and Boarders.
5. Students can also be asked to leave the school on the following grounds:
Disciplinary.
Unsatisfactory progress in work.
Repeated detention in a class.
6. TC for children for withdrawal will not be issued until all dues are settled by parents.

REFUND OF PRIVATE ACCOUNT BALANCE :

The private account balance will be refunded after three months from the date of issue of transfer certificate. The parents should submit a written application within the stipulated period. If no claim is lodged, the amount will lapse on completion of one academic year in December and the amount will be transferred to Alumnae Fund.

The school also organizes counselling sessions for its students to deal with behavioural and personal problems of the students on regular basis, for which the school hires the services of qualified / trained counsellors every year.

The school conducts and organizes seminars and workshops with renowned people in various fields of students' interest.

Personality grooming classes are organized for students of all classes. These classes are aimed at improving young boys for manners, etiquettes with a stress on value based development. The pedagogy consists of interactive sessions, group discussions and workshops. Students are trained on various aspects of social, family interaction and situations. Specially designed audio-visual room and aids are used to bring about desired result of fineness, confidence and humility in growing boys to become complete human beings.

1. The School has a qualified and experienced Doctor, who visits the School infirmary regularly. Cases of minor ailments are cared for in the school infirmary while cases requiring hospital care are transferred to the local Govt. Hospital, Nainital. Parents are informed when a student is transferred to the hospital. The bills on account of treatment are sent to the parents.
2. Expenditure on Medicines, X-rays, hospitalization, operations or treatment by specialist doctors will be billed to the parents.
3. The school maintains the medical record of each boarder and parents are requested to assist the school in maintaining accurate records which may be of help in an emergency.
4. **A medical certificate to the effect that a child is not suffering from any infectious disease or constitutional disorder rendering him unfit for residence in the hills must be sent to the Principal before a student can be admitted.**
5. Should it be discovered that a student is suffering from a chronic illness or infirmity subsequent to admission, the Principal will have the right to require the withdrawal of the student from the school.
6. A student who has suffered from an infectious disease during any vacation shall not be permitted to return unless he is medically cleared by both, the family doctor as well as by the Medical Officer of the school.
7. Children's eyesight and teeth must be attended to during the long vacations and not kept pending for the school authorities to tend to during the regular session.
8. While all reasonable care will be exercised for the supervision of the students and their safety, the management accepts no responsibility, moral or legal, for injuries or accidents sustained by a student while he is a member of the School.
9. In the event of a serious illness of a Boarder his parents are informed immediately. They may keep in constant touch with the school over the phone.

LEAVE :

1. A list of holidays is sent to the parents at the beginning of each academic session.
2. Students will be granted leave subject to whether their:
 - a. Work and conduct is satisfactory. No parents can demand leave, if for some reason it has been denied to the student.
 - b. Parents, or any other person authorized by the parents in writing, have to collect the child. Two copies of photographs of the parents, or any other person authorized by the parents, will be kept in child's personal file.
3. If a boarder fails to report to the school by the specified time, without notice and prior permission from the Principal, a fine of Rs.1000/- can be imposed and the student will have to forfeit the next leave due, and should even this fail to ensure his reporting punctually in future, he will be asked to leave the school. Parents are requested to ensure that their children return to the school by the specified time after the midterm and winter holidays.

Note: No parent can visit the child during the weekdays. They can visit only when an outing is given as per the school fixture or with prior permission of the Principal.

GOING OUT :

1. Permission to stay overnight will be granted only to the parents and local guardian authorized by the parents.
2. No person below the age of 25 years will be authorized by the parents to collect the child.
3. Frequent visits by the parents are unsettling for the children, hence parents are requested to co-operate in observing these rules. Parents should allow their children to adjust to their new environment.

TUTORIAL CLASSES :

1. Most subject teachers are available to individual students, or groups of students, on mutually convenient times to assist them, on a voluntary basis, at their weaker subjects.
2. In order to help weak students to come up to the standard, special tutorials are organized by the school on extra payments.

GENERAL RULES :

1. LPS believes in firmness and discipline. Disobedience and disregard of rules is not tolerated. The students have to follow a code of conduct. Any violation of the code of conduct will call for disciplinary action. Students are expected to conduct themselves with dignity and poise, be polite and courteous to their parents and elders and co-operate with their colleagues. Parents' co-operation with the school is crucial in helping their child develop into a worthy citizen of tomorrow.
2. **Telephone calls.** Telephone facility through wardens is available to boarding children on fixed days of the week.
3. **Food Parcels.** The School does not permit food parcels or fruit parcels to the students, as parcels usually arrive late or in damaged condition and fruits often get over-ripe and unfit for consumption. **NO TUCK SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE STUDENTS**
4. **Possession of expensive articles.** Parents are advised not to send their children with expensive electronic items **such as** watches, cameras, etc. The School will not be responsible for any loss incurred by the student. Mobile phones / i-pods / MP3,4 should not be given to the children. If a mobile or i-pod / MP3,4 is found in the possession of any school child, strict action will be taken. All banned items, if found, will be confiscated and will not be returned under any circumstances.

5. **Additional Pocket Money.** Parents are requested not to give any extra pocket money to their children during their visits. This rule has been made with the intention of preventing the students from developing undesirable habits and also with a view to minimizing differences between the children based purely on the financial status of the parents. No money order is to be sent to the students directly. If on checking, any money is found, it will be confiscated and transferred to the school fund.
6. **Spoken English.** It is expected that each student will make most of the opportunities available to him of perfecting his command over spoken English. He must, therefore converse in English at all times.
7. **Deference.** The students must show due respect to their teachers and all members of the staff, to parents and well-wishers of the school and to all casual visitors who come to the campus on sight-seeing visits or otherwise.
8. **Vested Power.** Acting on behalf of the Managing Committee, the Principal is empowered to waive any of the rules in the prospectus without assigning any reason for his / her action.
9. **Managerial Power.** The interpretation of any rule in the prospectus, as well as any amendment to it, rests solely and entirely with the Managing Committee of the School. Their interpretation will be final and binding on parents and guardians and in no case shall lie in a Court of Law, irrespective of their decision.
10. Parents are requested not to meet the teaching staff directly. No verbal assurance given by any member of the staff will be binding on the school. Parents should always write to the Principal on any point they wish to make or clarify.
11. Corporal punishment is banned in school.

SCHOLARSHIPS & AWARDS :

1. The School provides scholarships to meritorious students, as also concessions in fee to the deserving poor students and wards of freedom fighters.
2. LPS-Dr. Giribala Pant Meritorious awards are given to the first three position holders of the Xth Board Examination. The award carries a cash prize of Rs. 5,000/-, 4,000/- and 3,000/- to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd position holders respectively along with a medal and a certificate.
3. LPS-Dr. Giribala Pant Means-cum-Merit Awards are given to meritorious students from EWS, one each from class II to X. The award carries a cash prize of Rs. 5,000/-, a medal and a certificate.
4. LPS-Dr. Giribala Pant Means-cum-Merit Sr. Secondary Awards carrying a cash prize of Rs.5000/ are given to 2 students who pass out from school and take admission elsewhere as per scholarship rules.
5. The school also gives away LPS-Vivek Kaushik Student of the year award each year to one student, carrying a cash prize of Rs. 5000/-, a certificate and a trophy.
6. LPS-Gp. Capt. R.P. Sharma Young Mathematician Award, carrying a cash prize of Rs. 4,000/-, a medal and a certificate are given in three categories: junior, middle and senior.
7. The school also gives away LPS-Champa Devi Most Regular Student Award in three Categories: senior, middle and junior. The award consists of cash, a medal and a certificate.
8. The topper of the Xth Board Examination is also awarded “LPS- C.D. Tripathi Memorial Award”. Selection is based on academics and other parameters set by the school from time to time.
9. School has instituted awards for Most Popular Student Teacher's Choice and Students' Choice. All Rounder awards in 3 categories, junior, middle and senior are also given.

CLOTHING LIST :

1. Uniform must be purchased from the School-approved supplier in Nainital. This is to ensure standardization and quality of uniform. Any variation in colour will not be accepted.
2. All other items except (1) may be purchased by the parents from any shop of their choice.
3. The details of the clothing and toilet requisites for the year would be intimated to the students at the time of confirmation of admission.

REGISTRATION FORM :

1. A copy of the Registration form is enclosed with the Prospectus.
2. The following documents must be sent along with the Registration form:-
 - A passport size photograph of the candidate, attached firmly to the upper right hand corner of the form.
 - A copy of the same photograph, attached firmly to the right hand corner of the Admit Card, for the Assessment / Admission Process.
 - A self- attested duplicate copy of the candidate's Birth Certificate.
 - Photocopy of the progress report of the examination last appeared.
 - Two self-addressed, stamped envelopes (Registered Mail Postage).
 - Registration form, duly completed, is to reach the school office by last date mentioned at the time of procuring the form.

ADMISSION PROCESS :

1. Registration forms are normally given away beginning July each year for the academic session starting March next year.
2. Selection process only for class 1 (Day Scholars only) and class 2 and 3 (Boarders and Day Scholars) is normally conducted. In the event of vacancies which occur from time to time because of withdrawals due to transfer or other unforeseen reasons, school may declare vacancies and admit new students on the basis of their academic performance in other schools and their assessment by school.
3. Admission process for the registered students will be conducted for class I in the month of December and for other classes in the month of February of the academic session. Assessment dates and timings will be intimated by the office separately by registered post or over telephone.
4. English, Hindi, Mathematics, General Science and Aptitude are the subjects that are assessed at the time of admission to check the suitability of the class applied for.
5. A candidate who is a bonafide resident of Nainital and nearby towns will be eligible for admission as day-scholar. Candidates staying with relatives or boarding outside with friends or others are not eligible for admission as day-scholars. In rare cases, they may however be accepted for admission only when the School Management / Principal is satisfied and written guarantee is furnished by parents for proper care and discipline.

Following the assessment and interaction, successful candidates will be informed by registered post or other means as deemed fit.
